### **DOT / Municipalities / Consultants:**

9<sup>th</sup> MTQ Bridge Dept. Met with Nicolas Fauchon (replaced Gerard Desgagne) & staff on

standards. MTQ will not approve 75 years for polymer coated plate until bolts pass abrasion tests. Tome (standards) update submissions need

to be in by June each year.

10<sup>th</sup> MTQ Lab Met with Donald Villeneuve to discuss next round of NZF3000 bolt

testing. Dropped off 8 samples of each bolt (3 coating layers of

NZF3000, HDG & MG). MTQ require some additional information before

testing starts. In process gathering information.

### YTD - 28 visits

Ongoing discussions with the cities of Halifax and Region of Waterloo who have both rejected inclusion of spiral rib pipe in their storm sewer standards. In Halifax, the discussion has been elevated to the office of the Mayor and General Manager. To be discussed with committee at next PPC meeting. In Waterloo Region, limits to flexible pipe diameter are unacceptable. Discussion needs to move to the cities of Guelph, Waterloo, Kitchener, Cambridge, Wilmot and surrounding townships.

Attended the TAC conference in Halifax as an exhibitor and attended 4 fall committee meetings as follows:

Submitted a proposal to include a workshop / project on incorporating EPD's in government procurement policies. Great deal of interest was shown to include in spring meetings next April in Ottawa. Climate change was the number one topic. Trade show was lightly attended this year from government civil servants due to major cutbacks in Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, & Ontario.

- 4. Polymer Laminated 5-year repair project with Alberta Trans. Visited site on August 13<sup>th</sup>. Final year's report issued. Once approved, project is completed.
- 5. Polymer laminated site in Bancroft ON visited August 21<sup>st</sup>. Report completed. Included in October 1<sup>st</sup> E-Blast.
- 6. St. Lawrence seaway test commenced for polymer coated plate, polymer laminated CSP and NZF3000 bolts. Report to be issued.

- 4. EPD was asked on 4 different occasions for a copy from Quebec & New Brunswick. Great deal of interest on carbon footprint of CSP
- 5. Quebec lobbyist ongoing discussions with the Registry as to CSPI's application continues
- 6. E-Blasts "Climate Change, Everyone's Business" sent out on Sept 24<sup>th</sup>. Response close to 15% at time of writing. "Perception versus Reality" sent out on Oct 1<sup>st</sup>.
